I have this date filed the 1982 Tentative Ad Valorem Budget with the Town Clerk.

A Summary of Essential Facts:

The above appropriations are the net result of a series of different budget cutting sessions with department heads. Cuts in position requests and equipment items totaled over \$1,000,000. We plan to continue all essential services with "bare bones" appropriations.

The appropriation increases have been reduced essentially to:

1. Wage adjustments required by the labor contracts of our 4 bargaining units
2. Rising utility costs
3. Mandated fringe benefit programs

A fairly static revenue pattern leaves an increased real property tax levy as the required budget balancing factor. Our fund balances have been applied in the previous two years' budgets to the point where there are no

significant balances remaining. There has been no material growth in our assessed valuation which further complicates our budget problems.

Our Federal Revenue Sharing revenue estimates are based upon the last official communication from that department. They do not include any 12% (\$115,000) reduction. Should this materialize we will have to make further revisions. The Federal Revenue Sharing has been appropriated towards police wages, police vehicles and drainage improvements.

I have this date filed the 1982 Tentative Ad Valorem Budget with the Town Clerk.

A Summary of Essential Facts:

The above appropriations are the net result of a series of different budget cutting sessions with department heads. Cuts in position requests and equipment items totaled over \$1,000,000. We plan to continue all essential services with "bare bones" appropriations.

The appropriation increases have been reduced essentially to:

1. Wage adjustments required by the labor contracts of our 4 bargaining units
2. Rising utility costs
3. Mandated fringe benefit programs

A fairly static revenue pattern leaves an increased real property tax levy as the required budget balancing factor. Our fund balances have been applied in the previous two years' budgets to the point where there are no

significant balances remaining. There has been no material growth in our assessed valuation which further complicates our budget problems.

Our Federal Revenue Sharing revenue estimates are based upon the last official communication from that department. They do not include any 12% (\$115,000) reduction. Should this materialize we will have to make further revisions. The Federal Revenue Sharing has been appropriated towards police wages, police vehicles and drainage improvements.







THIS AGREEMENT, entered into the ____ day of _____, 1981, by and between the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, NEW YORK, hereinafter referred to as the "Town" and the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA CAPTAINS AND LIEUTENANTS ASSOCIATION, hereinafter referred to as the "Association".

ARTICLE I

SECTION 1.01 - PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

The parties hereto desire to provide, through this Agreement: methods for orderly collective bargaining between the Town and the Association; to secure prompt and equitable disposition of grievances that may arise; to establish fair wages, fringe benefits and working conditions for police personnel in the negotiating unit; and to promote, to the highest degree, efficiency in providing service to the public.

In consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements, herein contained, the Town and the Association, through their authorized representatives, agree as follows:

SECTION 1.02 - APPLICABLE LAW

This Agreement has been negotiated pursuant to the provisions of the Public Employees Fair Employment Act and is governed by the provisions of the New York State Law and also non-conflicting local laws of the Town.

SECTION 1.03 - LEGISLATIVE REQUIREMENTS

IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT ANY PROVISION OF THIS AGREEMENT REQUIRING LEGISLATIVE ACTION TO PERMIT ITS IMPLEMENTATION BY AMENDMENT OF LAW OR BY PROVIDING THE ADDITIONAL FUNDS THEREFORE, SHALL NOT BECOME EFFECTIVE UNTIL THE APPROPRIATE LEGISLATIVE BODY HAS GIVEN APPROVAL.

ARTICLE II

SECTION 2.01 - RECOGNITION

The Town recognizes the Association as the sole and exclusive representative and collective bargaining agent for all police captains and lieutenants in the negotiating unit who are hereinafter referred to, individually as "Captain or Lieutenant" and collectively as "Captains and Lieutenants".

The negotiating unit is defined as: all police captains and lieutenants, employed in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, pursuant to the New York State Civil Service Law, excepting captains or lieutenants holding the rank of Chief of Police, Assistant Chief of Police.

This recognition shall extend for the maximum period of time allowed by law and until the expiration of this Agreement, according to its terms. The Town shall not negotiate, during this Agreement, with any organization, on behalf of the police officers, defined herein, other than the Association and, unless notified by the Town, the Association will undertake to negotiate and represent the same unit for a successive agreement.

ARTICLE III

SECTION 3.01 - DUES CHECKOFF

Upon written authorization from a captain or lieutenant, on a form provided by the Association, the Town will deduct from the salary of such captain or lieutenant, from the first pay-period of each month, membership dues as the captain or lieutenant may specify, and the Town will transmit said sums, promptly to the Association, within five (5) days after the deduction has been made.

The Town agrees to deduct from the wage or salary of captain or lieutenant, represented by the Association, who are not members of the Association, an amount equivalent to the dues levied by the Association on its members, and such sums shall be transmitted by the Town to the President or Treasurer of the Association.

The Association, pursuant to such deductions, agrees to establish and maintain a procedure providing for the refund of any non-member captain or lieutenant demanding the return of any part of such agency fee deduction which represents his pro-rata share of the expenditures by the Club in aid of activities or causes of a political or ideological nature, only incidentally related to terms and conditions of employment.

SECTION 3.02 - NEW JOB CLASSIFICATIONS

The Town agrees that in the event it establishes any new classifications, recognized within the negotiating unit, the Town will furnish

the Association with the new job description and will confer and negotiate with Association the basic annual salaries for each such position.

ARTICLE IV

SECTION 4.01 - UNIFORM ALLOWANCE

Each captain or lieutenant shall be paid the sum of \$300.00 for the year 1981, for the purchase and maintenance of police clothing, uniforms and equipment and for the maintenance and cleaning of the same.

Each captain or lieutenant shall be paid the sum of \$370.00 for the year 1982, for the purchase and maintenance of police clothing, uniforms and equipment and for the maintenance and cleaning of the same.

Uniform allowance will be paid by January 30th of each year.

Each captain or lieutenant will be responsible for maintenance of his uniforms and equipment and failure to reasonably maintain the same may be the subject of disciplinary action.

The Town will negotiate with the Association, regarding the impact of changes in articles of clothing or equipment.

ARTICLE V

SECTION 5.01 - SENIORITY WITHIN RANK

Seniority within rank shall be determined according to the date of promotion in rank; and in the event promotion in rank is on the same date, then position of the Civil Service list from which the officer was originally promoted will govern. Captains and Lieutenants shall have the right to select their shift according to seniority.

SECTION 5.02 - TRANSFERS AND FILLING OF VACANCIES

The transferring and assignments of Captains and Lieutenants will be the responsibility of the Chief of Police, in accordance with Section 5.01 and 5.02(a) of this agreement.

5.02(a) - When a vacancy exists in a non-competative job classification, the Chief of Police shall notify, in writing, officers of qualified rank, offering them an opportunity to indicate their desire to be considered for the filling of such vacancy.

When such a vacancy exists, the Captains and Lieutenants shall be selected from those who have indicated their desire and interest to fill the vacancy, based in seniority and experience, provided that the decision is not arbitrary or capricious.

ARTICLE VI

SECTION 6.01 - SALARIES

Each Captain or Lieutenant shall be paid pursuant to the following salary schedule:

January 1, 1981	Captains	\$25,570.00
	Lieutenants	\$23,051.00
July 1, 1981	Captains	\$26,593.00
	Lieutenants	\$23,973.00
January 1, 1982	Captains	\$28,188.00
	Lieutenants	\$25,411.00
July 1, 1982	Captains	\$29,372.00
	Lieutenants	\$26,479.00

SECTION 6.02 - OUT OF RANK PAY

If the Table Organization established by the Town requires a Captain on a particular shift, and a captain is not present or will not be present for eight (8) or more hours, the senior available Lieutenant on that shift shall serve as "Acting Captain" and shall be compensated on an out-of-rank basis as "Acting Captain" for each hour worked.

SECTION 6.03 - RATE OF PAY

The hourly rate of pay shall be obtained by dividing the annual salary by 2080.

SECTION 6.04 - OVERTIME PAY

Overtime shall be all work beyond a normally scheduled eight-hour tour of duty and any work beyond a normally scheduled forty (40) hour work week.

All overtime work shall be paid at the rate of time and one-half.

SECTION 6.05 - ESTABLISHMENT OF SALARIES

The Agreement of the parties as to wages in future contracts is as follows:

Lieutenants salaries shall be computed at twenty (20) percent above the top salary of a patrolman which is currently the fourth year.

Captains salaries shall be computed at ten (10) percent above the salary of a lieutenant.

SECTION 6.06 - LONGEVITY PAY

(a) The members of the Association shall be granted the following longevity increments:

After 8 years of service	\$150.00
After 12 years of service	300.00
After 15 years of service	550.00
After 18 years of service	650.00

(b) Effective January 1, 1982, the members of the Association shall be granted the following longevity increments.

After 6 years of service	\$175.00
After 12 years of service	250.00
After 18 years of service	350.00

This longevity schedule in (b) shall replace the longevity schedule in (a) above effective January 1, 1982. The longevity in schedule (b) shall be cumulative at each of the three increments above.

Longevity pay will be paid within thirty (30) days after a captains or lieutenants anniversary date and will be included in salary for all purposes, including retirement purposes.

SECTION 6.07 - REDEMPTION OF ACCUMULATED TIME

The Town will have the right to buy back compensatory time on the books for all captains and lieutenants or a portion of such compensatory time over 120 hours. If a captain or lieutenant has over 120 hours accumulated, the Chief may at his option, order the captain or lieutenant to take time off or pay the officer for all or a portion of the hours over 120. The Chief will exercise this option right from November 15th to December 15th of each year.

SECTION 6.08 - EDUCATION INCENTIVE PAY

Effective January 1, 1982 each captain or lieutenant who attends, or has attended, approved Police Science Courses shall receive educational incentive payments annually as follows:

1. One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) a year to a police officer who has an Associate Art and Science Degree (two (2) year program); or
2. Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) to a police officer who has a Bachelor of Science or a Bachelor of Arts Degree (four (4) year program).

SECTION 6.09 - ADDITIONAL SALARIES

All members of the Association shall be paid pursuant to and consistent with the salary schedules set forth in Section 6.01. For the responsibility of filing reports and the necessary administrative procedures required, previous and subsequent to the regularly scheduled tour of work, each member shall receive two hundred (\$200.00) dollars to be added to and pro-rated with his regular salary.

ARTICLE VII

SECTION 7.01 - WORK DAY AND WORK WEEK

The standard work day shall be eight (8) hours and the standard work week shall be forty (40) hours. The work day and work week shall be pursuant to existing New York State Law. Whenever practicable, two (2) consecutive days-off shall be provided within a seven (7) day calendar period. Each captain or lieutenant shall be entitled to a thirty (30) minute lunch period in each eight (8) hour tour of duty. When practicable, each captain or lieutenant shall work a three (3) platoon system.

Each captain or lieutenant shall sign-in at the start of his tour of duty and sign-out at the end of his tour of duty in order to be compensated. A daily record shall be kept by the department head or his agent, which record shall be collected, daily, and be made part of the employee's personnel record. Each captain or lieutenant shall observe the scheduled work hours that are posted in all reports of duty, according to the posted time and date.

ARTICLE VIII

SECTION 8.01 - COURT PAY

If a member is required to make a court appearance within his own jurisdiction at any time other than his regularly scheduled working hours, he shall be allowed a minimum of three (3) hours paid time at his standard hourly rate. If a member is required to make a court appearance outside of the Town's jurisdiction, then he shall be allowed a minimum of four (4) hours paid time at his standard hourly wage rate. If any court appearance exceeds the minimum standards set, the member shall be entitled to payment for all actual hours spent at his standard hourly rate.

Verification of time in court shall be made by presenting the appropriate form to the Chief of Police. Said form is to be signed by the presiding judge, administrative officer or court clerk. Every reasonable effort will be made to provide this payment in the pay period immediately subsequent to the submission of the verification form.

ARTICLE IX

SECTION 9.01 - HOLIDAYS

Each captain or lieutenant shall be given compensatory time-off or be paid the value of the following holidays, whether he works the holiday or not:

Each captain or lieutenant shall notify the Chief of Police, or his designee, by December 1, as to the holidays he elects to be paid for and the holidays he elects for compensatory time-off, during the following year.

In addition to the above holidays, each captain or lieutenant shall be given compensatory time-off for any holiday granted to other employees of the Town of Cheektowaga, by resolution of the Town Board or declaration of the Town Supervisor. A captain or lieutenant who elects to be paid for a holiday may be granted the day off which shall be charged against the captain's or lieutenant's accumulated compensatory time-off, without loss of the holiday pay.

ARTICLE X

SECTION 10.01 - VACATIONS

Each police officer shall be entitled to an annual vacation, with pay, during each calendar years as follows:

After 1 year	12 working days
After 5 years	18 working days
After 10 years	21 working days
After 15 years	25 working days
After 20 years	28 working days

Request for vacation period will be submitted in writing and approved by the Commanding Officer.

The lower badge number and rank shall determine seniority, and vacation approval shall be based upon the seniority of the Captain and Lieutenant of each shift.

SECTION 10.02 - UNUSED VACATION

Notwithstanding any provision of the law to the contrary, each member of the Association shall be entitled to be paid, at the time of his retirement from the Department, the monetary value of any unused vacation time and overtime standing to his credit on the date of his retirement. In the case of death in service of any Captain or Lieutenant, the value of such time standing to his credit shall be paid to his estate or as is otherwise provided by law.

Police officers intending to retire may notify the Town two (2) years in advance and will be permitted to accumulate time-off and vacations for one and one-half years, the value of which will be paid as salary during the final year of employment and included as wages for pension purposes.

SECTION 10.03 - VACATION PAY ADVANCE

Upon written request, at least two (2) weeks prior to vacation time, a police officer will be paid the estimated amount due him for his vacation period, not later than the Friday before he begins his vacation.

ARTICLE XI

SECTION 11.01 - BEREAVEMENT LEAVE

Upon request of a captain or lieutenant, a leave of absence, not to exceed five (5) days shall be granted, because of death in his immediate family. Such leave shall be taken, without loss of pay or other benefits, and shall begin on the date of death. Immediate family, for the purposes of this Section, shall mean: mother, father, spouse, child, grandchild, grandparent, brother, sister, father-in-law, mother-in-law, daughter-in-law and son-in-law.

In the event of the death of a captain's or lieutenant's brother-in-law or sister-in-law, and upon request, he shall be granted two (2) days off, without loss of pay or other benefits. In the event of death of a relative, not included above, the captain or lieutenant, upon request, shall be granted time-off without loss of pay or other benefits, for the day of the funeral, which time shall be charged against accumulated time-off or sick leave, at the captain's or lieutenant's choice.

ARTICLE XII

SECTION 12.01 - PERSONAL LEAVE

Each police officer shall be entitled to five (5) non-cumulative personal leave days. Personal leave shall be used at the police officer's discretion, except, that personal leave shall not be taken on a Sunday or a holiday, except in case of emergency. In order to enable the department to maintain necessary manpower requirements, personal leave must be requested at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance of the requested time-off. This will not preclude the granting of personal leave on less than twenty-four (24) hours notice, upon the approval of the commanding officer. Personal leave will not be granted if the granting of such leave will seriously hamper or impede the operation of the police department. Personal leave requested in case of emergency, however, will not be denied.

Personal leave will not be used in less than one-half day increments.

Personal leave will be granted based upon the priority of the emergency and if no emergency exists, upon the chronological time requested.

Unused personal leave days shall be added to accumulated sick leave.

ARTICLE XIII

SECTION 13.01 - SICK LEAVE

Each captain or lieutenant except as otherwise provided, shall be entitled to accumulate one and one-half sick days per month to a maximum accumulation of 298 days.

A female captain or lieutenant who is incapable of performing her duties because of maternity disability may utilize accumulated sick leave credits and continue all other benefits under this Agreement during such absence.

Maternity leave shall be considered to commence on the date that the officer is no longer capable of performing her duties and shall end on the date the officer can resume the performance of her regular duties. The officer will be requested or required to bring in a doctor's note to verify the date when she is not capable of performing her duties or when she is capable of returning to work. In addition, she may be required to submit to a physical examination by a doctor of the Town's choice to verify the starting and ending date of such maternity leave.

SECTION 13.02 - CERTIFICATE OF DISABILITY

The Chief of Police may require a member's physician to file a certificate of disability within eight (8) days of the commencement of disability or sick leave in excess of six (6) days. The Chief may require additional certificates in cases where future sick leave is requested.

SECTION 13.03 - EXTENDED SICK LEAVE

If a member has exhausted his sick leave, he may be granted additional sick leave, not to exceed ninety (90) days, upon the approval of the Town Board. Said extension shall not be charged against future sick leave.

The Town may require proof of said disability, by having the member's physician submit periodic medical reports. The Board may at any time require a member to be examined by an independent physician designated by the Board at its expense.

The granting or denying of an additional sick leave, as above stated shall be the sole discretion of the Town Board. Their decision is final and binding on all parties and is not reviewable through the grievance procedure.

SECTION 13.04 - WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION

Members who are injured in the course of their employment and receive Workmen's Compensation benefits shall receive their full pay and they assign the proceeds of the Workmen's Compensation benefits to the Town.

No part of said absence shall be charged against the member's accumulated sick leave.

SECTION 13.05 - ILLNESS OF FAMILY MEMBERS

Sick leave shall apply to absence due to illness of a police officer's immediate family, residing in his household.

SECTION 13.06 - SICK LEAVE UPON RETIREMENT

1. One year prior to retirement, a captain or lieutenant may convert his accumulated sick leave days into value by written application signifying his intention, on a form provided by the Town.

2. Upon receipt of such notification, the Town will convert such accumulated sick leave into value by taking the actual cash value of the accumulated sick days and multiplying by the rate of 25%. The resulting sum shall be paid to the captain or lieutenant at his option exercised in writing in the following manner:

(a) The sum shall be paid to the captain or lieutenant as part of his final year's average salary by dividing the sum by the number of pay periods so as to allow for equal distribution over his last year of employment, or

(b) The sum shall be paid to the captain or lieutenant on the date of his retirement.

3. If a captain or lieutenant shall notify the Town of his intention to retire and such notice is given less than one year prior to the date of retirement, the Town will have the option of making a one-time lump sum payment or of dividing the sum by the number of pay periods, remaining, so as to allow for equal distribution during the remaining time of employment.

ARTICLE XIV

SECTION 14.01 - EXPENSES

A captain or lieutenant who is required to leave the Town, by reason of his employment or as part of his official duty, shall be reimbursed for all actual, reasonable and necessary expenses incurred, including meals, if he is absent from the Town during normal meal time.

A captain or lieutenant on official police business will be provided with transportation by the Town and if he is required to use his own vehicle on police business, the officer shall be paid at the current rate per mile for each mile driven. In no event will a captain or lieutenant be required to use his own motor vehicle during the normal course of his employment.

ARTICLE XV

SECTION 15.01 - LIFE INSURANCE

The Town will continue to provide a \$20,000 life insurance policy insuring each captain or lieutenant at no cost to the officer.

SECTION 15.02 - HEALTH INSURANCE

The Town will provide, at its own expense, Blue Cross and Blue Shield Insurance at least equivalent to the 50-51 Plan, together with the \$250,000 Major Medical with \$50. deductible and \$1.00 co-pay prescription rider.

Beginning January 1, 1982, the Town will provide, without cost to the captain or lieutenant, Blue Cross and Blue Shield dental coverage of the high level rider A, B, C, D and No. 8. However, if the rates for such coverage are increased after January 1, 1982 the parties will negotiate concerning the increase.

Beginning July 1, 1982, in addition to the above coverages, the Town will provide optical coverage afforded under the Blue Cross and Blue Shield plans commonly referred to as the Vision Care Benefits.

Beginning July 1, 1982, the Town will continue to provide health insurance for officers who retire, thereafter, up to age 65 years. Officers who retire before that date shall have the option of participating in the health insurance coverage plan at their own expense.

SECTION 15.03 - INDEMNIFICATION

The Town will indemnify each captain or lieutenant for claims made against him based upon false arrest, false imprisonment, civil rights violations and other torts within indemnification coverage pursuant to the provisions of Section 50-j of the General Municipal Law and Section 1983 et seq of the United States Code.

ARTICLE XVI

SECTION 16.01 - RETIREMENT BENEFITS

The Town will provide and maintain a non-contributory retirement plan of benefits for police officers, pursuant to the following provisions of the New York State Retirement and Social Security Law:

The benefits provided in Section 384 f, g and h to provide what is commonly known as the 1/60th, 25-year retirement plan;

The benefits pursuant to Section 375(i), more commonly known as the Improved Retirement Benefits;

The benefits pursuant to Section 302, 9-d, more commonly referred to as the Final Average Salary, and Section 360-b, Death Benefit; and

The benefits pursuant to Section 384-d, more commonly known as the 20-Year Retirement Plan.

ARTICLE XVII

SECTION 17.01 - DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF ASSOCIATION REPRESENTATIVES

Captains and Lieutenants who are designated by the Association as representatives for the purpose of adjusting grievances or assisting in negotiating and administration of this or future agreements shall be permitted a reasonable amount of time from their regular duties to fulfill these obligations when and if so required. Reasonable advanced notice shall be given to the Head of the Department of his representative, stating in brief, the reason for such required absence.

Whenever possible, a request for time off shall be submitted at least three (3) days prior to the effective date thereof. The parties hereto agree that the circumstances may arise which will not permit a full three (3) days' notice and that the time permission for time shall be provided at a reasonable request.

Captains and lieutenants who are designated by the said Association to attend state-wide conventions and meetings of the Police Conference of N.Y., Inc. and the Western New York Police Assn., Inc. in the pursuance of their profession as police officers shall be authorized to do so without loss of time or pay. This privilege shall be extended additionally to officers of Western New York Police Association.

Additional officers may be granted this privilege by the Town if functioning of the Police Department is not placed in jeopardy by such attendance as approved by the Department. Captains and Lieutenants who are designated by the Association may attend state-wide conventions and meetings of the Police Conference of N.Y., Inc. and the Western New York Police Assn., Inc. provided that these are limited to New York State and in pursuance of their profession as police officers. Attendance at such affairs shall be without loss of time or pay. This privilege shall be extended additionally to officers of the Western New York Police Assn. and officers of the Police Lieutenants and Captains Assn. in order that they can attend their meetings on the same basis, provided that no more than five (5) policemen can attend under this provision.

ARTICLE XVIII

SECTION 18.01 - DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

A captain or lieutenant will be given a copy of any warning, reprimand, suspension or disciplinary action entered into his personnel record within two (2) weeks of the action taken.

SECTION 18.02 - RECORD OF COMPLAINTS

No record or reference to a complaint, either departmental or external, lodged against a captain or lieutenant will be entered into his record if after investigation the complaint is decided, by the Town, to be unfounded.

SECTION 18.03 - SUBSTANCE OF COMPLAINTS

A captain or lieutenant who has a complaint lodged against him by a citizen shall have the substance of the complaint presented to him in writing.

ARTICLE XIX

SECTION 19.01 - IN-SERVICE TRAINING

Any captain or lieutenant required to attend in-service training on his off-duty time, shall be compensated for such time at his regular rate of pay with a minimum pay of two (2) hours.

The Town will notify all captains and lieutenants, by posting, of law enforcement educational and training opportunities being offered by other departments or other police or educational agencies, so that captains and lieutenants who are eligible and who desire to attend may notify their superiors of their interest or desire. The Town will provide the same notice and opportunity as to training opportunities being offered by the Town Police Department.

SECTION 19.02 - TUITION

The Town will pay the full costs of all tuition, books and other fees for all police officers, authorized by the Town, who attend school or seminars relating to Police Science courses.

ARTICLE XX

SECTION 20.01 - BULLETIN BOARD

The Town will provide one bulletin board at the police station which will be used exclusively for Association notices.

SECTION 20.02 - MEETING ROOM

The Town will continue to provide a meeting room in the police station for use by the Association, without cost, where the Association may transact business and engage in other activities and also store its records and equipment. The meeting room will be furnished by the Association and the location of the same will be mutually agreed upon by the Town and the Association.

SECTION 20.03 - FUND RAISING

The Association may engage in fund raising activities, provided, that said activities do not interfere with the efficient operation of the department and do not violate any law, rule or regulation.

ARTICLE XXI

SECTION 21.01 - GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

A grievance shall mean any difference or dispute, between the parties hereto, as to the interpretation or application of any portion of this Agreement or any administrative act affecting general working conditions.

Step 1 - Any captain or lieutenant may present a grievance, orally or in writing, to his immediate supervisor within thirty (30) days of the occurrence and attempt to adjust the matter. If the matter is not, satisfactorily adjusted the captain or lieutenant may request a representative of the Association meet with him and his immediate supervisor for the purpose of adjusting the grievance.

Step 2 - If the grievance is not satisfactorily settled, under Step 1, the Association's representative may forward the grievance to the Association's Grievance Committee. After review of the grievance, the Association will forward a copy of the grievance to the Chief of Police, within five (5) calendar days or receipt by the committee. The Chief of Police will, within five (5) calendar days of presentation to him, discuss the matter with the Association's Grievance Committee in an attempt to settle the grievance.

Step 3 - In the event the grievance is not settled under Step 2, above, a report of the grievance will be made by the Association's Grievance Committee and by the Chief of Police and each will furnish their report, within five (5) days, to the Town Supervisor or his representative. The Town Supervisor or his representative, will discuss the grievance with the Grievance Committee within fifteen (15) calendar days after receipt of the written report.

Step 4 - In the event the matter is not satisfactorily settled, either party may take the matter to arbitration, upon service of written notice to the other party of intention to do so. The notice must be served within thirty (30) calendar days after the close of discussion and in the event a notice of intention to arbitrate is not filed within thirty (30) days, the matter will be considered closed and not subject to further prosecution.

The arbitration proceeding shall be conducted by an arbitrator to be selected by the Town and the Association within thirty (30) days after notice has been given and from a panel of arbitrators supplied by the New York State Public Employment Relations Board.

The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on the parties and the arbitrator shall issue his decision within thirty (30) calendar days after the conclusion of testimony and argument unless such time is mutually extended. The arbitrator shall not have the power to amend, modify or delete any provision of this Agreement.

Expenses for arbitration shall be born equally by the Town and the Association. However, each party shall be responsible for compensating its own representatives who appear. Captains and Lieutenants who appear during their work hours will not suffer any loss of salary or other benefits. If either party desires a recording of the proceedings it must pay for the cost of the same and make a copy of the same available, without charge, to the other party and to the arbitrator.

SECTION 21.02 - GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE

The Grievance Committee shall consist of three (3) members selected by the Association who shall be permitted to leave work after reasonable notice to their respective supervisors, for the purpose of adjusting grievances and to attend required meetings or arbitrations in connection with the same.

ARTICLE XXII - BILL OF RIGHTS

The provisions of this Article shall not apply to criminal investigations or investigations of possible criminal activity or violations.

SECTION 22.01 - TIME OF INTERROGATION

The interrogation of captains and lieutenants shall be conducted at reasonable hours, preferably, when the officer is on duty and if not on duty during daylight hours, unless the exigencies of the investigation dictate otherwise.

SECTION 22.02 - IDENTIFICATION OF INVESTIGATING OFFICERS

A captain or lieutenant who is under investigation for a matter, which would not constitute a crime, must be informed of the name of the officer in charge of the investigation and the names of the officers who will be conducting any portion of interrogation or investigation.

SECTION 22.03 - INFORMATION REGARDING INVESTIGATION

An officer must be informed of the nature of an investigation before any interrogation begins. The information must be sufficient to reasonably inform him of the investigation which is being conducted.

SECTION 22.04 - LENGTH OF INTERROGATION

Interrogation shall be completed with reasonable dispatch. Reasonable rest periods will be allowed and time will be provided for personal necessities, meals, telephone calls and rest periods as reasonably required.

SECTION 22.05 - COERCION

A captain or lieutenant shall not be subjected to offensive language and shall not be threatened with transfer, dismissal or other disciplinary punishment. No promise or reward shall be made as an inducement to answering questions. Nothing herein is to be construed as to prohibit the investigating from informing an officer that his conduct may be subject to other disciplinary action with resultant disciplinary punishment.

SECTION 22.06 - RIGHT TO COUNSEL

A captain or lieutenant who is under investigation has the right to have a representative of the Association present and also has the right to the presence of an attorney, with him, during any questioning, hearing or interrogation.

SECTION 22.07 - RECORDING OF INTERROGATION

Interrogation of a captain or lieutenant for any disciplinary investigation will be recorded, either mechanically or by a stenographer, and there will be no off-the-record statements.

SECTION 22.08 - ADVICE OF CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS

If a captain or lieutenant is the subject or target of a disciplinary investigation he shall be advised of his constitutional rights.

SECTION 22.09 - FURNISHING OF COPIES

A captain or lieutenant under investigation will be furnished with a copy of any statement he has signed or made or of any proceedings that have been recorded, in any manner.

SECTION 22.10 - POLYGRAPH

Captains and lieutenants will not be given polygraphic examinations.

SECTION 22.11 - NON-WAIVER OF CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS

No captain or lieutenant will be required to or requested to waive constitutional rights granted under the United States or the New York State Constitution.

SECTION 22.12 - HEARING OFFICER

In the event the Town elects to select a hearing officer, pursuant to Section 75 of the Civil Service Law, who is not either a Town employee

or Town Official, then, in that event, the hearing officer will be mutually selected by the Town and by the Captain or Lieutenant who is charged. If the parties are unable to agree upon a hearing officer or if the hearing officer agreed upon is, or becomes unable to or unwilling to act, then the parties shall mutually apply to Special Term of the New York State Supreme Court for the appointment of a hearing officer.

ARTICLE XXIII

SECTION 23.01 - LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Captains and Lieutenants may be granted leave of absence, with or without pay, as provided for in the Civil Service Law of the State of New York.

SECTION 23.02 - NON-DISCRIMINATION

There will be no discrimination with respect to the race, color, creed, sex, political persuasion or because of a captain or lieutenant engaged in Association activities. All captains and lieutenants shall receive the full protection of all of the provisions herein.

SECTION 23.03 - PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS

The Town will provide a payroll savings and U.S. Savings Bond deduction plan and make it available for all captains and lieutenants who desire the same.

ARTICLE XXIV

SECTION 24.01 - MANAGEMENT RIGHTS

All of the authority, right and responsibilities possessed by the Board and not covered by this Agreement are retained by it, including, but not limited to, the right to determine the mission, purposes, objectives and policies of the Board; to determine the facilities, methods, means and number of personnel required for conduct of Board programs; to administer the examination, selection, recruitment, hiring, appraisal, training, retention, promotions, assignments or transfer of employees, pursuant to law; to direct, deploy and utilize the work force; to establish specifications for each class of positions, and to classify or reclassify and to allocate or reallocate new or existing positions, in accordance with law; and to discipline or discharge employees, in accordance with law, and within the provisions of this Agreement.

SECTION 24.02 - CONFORMITY TO LAW

If any section, sub-section, sentence, clause, phrase or any portion of this Agreement is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such provision shall be deemed a

separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not effect the validity of the remaining portions of this Agreement.

SECTION 24.03 - TERMS OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement, except as may be hereafter modified in writing, by both parties, shall become effective January 1, 1981 (retroactively) and remain in force until December 31, 1982, or until such time as a subsequent agreement becomes effective.

ARTICLE XXV

SECTION 25.01 - ELIMINATION OF NEGOTIATIONS

The Agreement of the parties was to establish a contract which would eliminate any major negotiations concerning subsequent contracts.

All future agreements shall be adjusted to reflect any non-wage changes in the Town of Cheektowaga Police Club, Inc.'s contract. These adjustments shall not include any changes exclusively omitted from this agreement.

The Association shall have the prerogative of discussing and negotiating any non-economic items that pertain exclusively to captains and lieutenants.

SECTION 25.02 - RENEWAL OF AGREEMENT

The parties agree that renewal of this Agreement shall commence on or about the completion of negotiations by the Town of Cheektowaga Police Club, Inc.

SECTION 25.03 - PAST PRACTICE

This agreement shall supersede conflicting rules, regulations or practices heretofore existing. Established practices, not specifically covered herein, shall continue in force and effect.

SECTION 25.04 - ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties.





The attached resolution is submitted for your approval of the above mentioned Change Order for an addition of \$4,174.00 to the contract of Frank L. Ciminelli Construction Company, Inc.

At the time the bids were received for the bridges known as Group A Structures (Parkedge, Rosewood and McNaughton) the lump sum bid for furnishing of necessary equipment for pile driving was in the amount of \$12,522.00. For bookkeeping purposes, the cost for furnishing the pile driving equipment was split three (3) ways and distributed to the structures requiring piles. The amount assessed to each was \$4,174.00.

On the McNaughton Avenue Bridge the piles could not be used due to the soil conditions and the elevation of the rock which the piles were to bear on. It was not possible to have a minimum of eight feet (8') of pile length in undisturbed soil. Accordingly, the foundations for the bridge on McNaughton Avenue were re-evaluated and an alternate design used, not requiring piles.

Inasmuch as the pile driving equipment was furnished for driving pile on the bridges in Group "A", the total lump sum amount is rightly owed to the contractor. In the processing of the Change Order #5 on McNaughton Avenue, the amount of \$4,174.00 was inadvertently credited to the Town along with the credit for the actual piles.


Based on the facts outlined above, we recommend approval of this Change Order #6 on McNaughton Avenue, and the amount of \$4,174.00 be added to the contract.

Honorable Town Board Members:

The Cheektowaga Town Board authorized the Town Clerk to send out "Requests for Proposals" (RFP), for the purchase of an "Electronic Data Processing System, Software, and Related Services". These RFPs were also available to vendors at the Town Clerk's Office.

These sealed RFPs were then opened at 7:00 p.m. on November 16, 1981. At the time of the opening, there were five (5) proposals received and representatives of four (4) of these companies were present.

The RFPs consisted of requirements pertaining to hardware, performance, software applications, and expansion capabilities.

In order to rank the proposals, it was necessary to evaluate them individually and then compare them one against the other. The first phase in the process was to determine if, in fact, all firms had complied with the requirements of the RFP, and provided both cost data and detailed explanations concerning hardware and supporting software systems.

During this phase it was discovered that four (4) vendors supplied enough information to properly evaluate the proposals. Some of these vendors did not have available some hardware and software requirements which has been taken into consideration in the evaluation overview for each vendor. The fifth vendor, MAS Tech did not supply enough information to properly evaluate their proposal, therefore, they are eliminated from consideration.

Phase 2 and 3 of the evaluation process consisted of an indepth look at the costs and type of hardware and software systems being proposed. Costs were computed, not only to show the initial capital investment, but also the ongoing costs of maintenance, which is also of importance. Even though it is my opinion that the proposed systems are adequate to handle at least fifteen years of additional growth and applications, I used five years as the basis of computing the proposals on a total cost basis. In computing the initial and recurring costs for all companies, the following is a listing of the results of the proposal (alphabetically listed).

As indicated in the results, the lower initial proposal is not the lowest in the longer planning period.

It was at this point that KVS and Value Management were eliminated from further consideration, basically due to prohibitive recurring costs and total five year costs.

Phase 4 was then to closely compare the remaining competitors as to the total overall proposals. Normally during this phase of the evaluation live demonstrations are conducted; however, the Town staff has viewed such demonstrations on the remaining systems. These demonstrations not only included examinations of the proposed hardware but also the software packages proposed.

Summarization: After examining the remaining proposals, I have arrived at the following determinations:

(A) BURROUGHS

After review of Burroughs bid, it was noted that there several deviations from bid specifications.

Burroughs had the opportunity to propose a removable disk or tape drive (which is what KVS did) containing a minimum of 10MB of storage to facilitate easy operation in backing up files. Either one of these methods would have been acceptable.

The two 3MB diskette method proposed by Burroughs does not meet the 10MB storage capacity required in the specifications. Furthermore, their back-up method would be inadequate for our operations because of its slow speed and need for frequent operator intervention.

The cost of a 10MB removable disk cartridge or a tape drive would have increased their proposed system cost anywhere from \$8,000 to \$12,000 which I added to the bid price at \$8,000.

Five application programs were required to be included in each vendor's bid. Detailed specifications for each program were given to the vendors. Burroughs failed to include the cost of developing two of the five application programs. They substituted two of their standard software tools which they stated "could be used to help meet some of your specific needs without incurring the cost of expensive programming modifications". Our specifications require that vendors provide all program coding for the five application programs.

Unfortunately, it is my opinion that with the items mentioned above, I could not recommend that Burroughs be awarded the bid.


(B) NCR

NCR's proposal had the lowest total cost over a five year period. After review of NCR's proposal, it was determined that hardware and software met the requirements specified by the Town. Another factor that was considered was a back-up site. I have been informed by the Town of Amherst that we could establish them as a back-up site and visa-versa. Also taken into consideration was the fact that NCR offered an accelerated implementation schedule which will help cut down on the present annual processing costs.

The application programs proposed have been demonstrated by NCR at local governmental sites, one of which is similar in size to Cheektowaga. In each case, these programs were found to be both complete and impressive. In addition, I feel we should add two additional programs offered by NCR at a five year cost of \$11,200.

Based on the reasons provided above, it is my recommendation to award the bid to NCR.

INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT
DESIGN REQUIREMENTS

I. LOT REQUIREMENTS

1. Front Yard: 50'.
2. Side Yard: two required.
 - a. minimum - 15 feet.
 - b. along an R district boundary - 50 feet.
3. Rear Yard
 - a. minimum - 10 feet.
 - b. along an R district boundary - 50 feet.
4. Maximum Building Height: 65 feet, unless governed by other restrictions (ie: Zoning Ordinance 4-04).

II. ROADWAYS

1. Minimum pavement width - 32 feet.
2. Minimum right-of-way - 72 feet.
3. Maximum grade - 5%.
4. Minimum 20' inside curve radius, 50' outside radius.
5. Minimum 60' cul-de-sac radius.
6. Curbing: where provided, curbing to be edged with concrete curbing (6" upright or 2'6" wide channel) on both sides along entire length (see drainage).
7. Pavement surfaces, subsurface materials and roadway cross-section to comply with Town public arterial standards and specifications.
8. Maximum of two points of vehicular access to any lot from public street.
9. Driveways to be 20' maximum width.
10. Minimum 50' spacing between driveways.
11. No parking allowed on any public road.

III. PARKING & SERVICE

1. All parking to be paved and striped.
2. Parking to be provided on site in accordance with following schedule:
 - a. Office - three spaces for each 1,000 sq. ft. of useable office area;
 - b. Warehousing/distribution - two spaces for each three employees, but in no case less than one space for each 2,000 sq. ft. of gross floor area;
 - c. Manufacturing - two spaces for each three employees, but in no case less than one space for each 1,000 sq. ft. of gross floor area.
3. Parking areas to be connected to main building entrance by paved 4'0" minimum width sidewalk.
4. No parking within 25' of non-industrially zoned districts.
5. All service roads, loading zones and aprons to be paved in accordance with Town Ordinance requirements.
6. Loading zones: areas designated for "loading and unloading" will have a necessary depth to avoid causing blockage of any public right-of-way.
7. Aprons to have minimum 50' width.
8. Service areas facing adjacent non-industrial districts to be visually screened, in accordance with landscaping standards.
9. Minimum 25' setback of service areas from adjacent non-industrial districts.

IV. LANDSCAPING

1. Minimum of 25% of lot area to be landscaped open space. Such space would include features such as lawns, shrubs, trees, fountains, ground covers, ornamental and passive recreation areas, and sculptures. Vehicular use areas are prohibited as part of the 25%.
2. Front yard lawn area (within 50 feet setback requirement) shall not serve a duplicate purpose for swales, water retention areas or similar such uses.
3. For each lot, one 2" caliper tree for every 20' of frontage will be planted in the landscaped open space area. It is recommended that such plantings be located in the front yard to the maximum feasible extent.

4. Site to be properly graded to eliminate standing water.
5. Parking lots and service areas adjacent to R districts shall be screened in one or more of the following manners:
 - a. Earth Berm, covered with appropriate landscaping;
 - b. Wood fencing of a uniform color, providing a minimum 80% level of opacity;
 - c. Masonry walls of a uniform color, except concrete blocks which shall be prohibited;
 - d. Shrubs and/or evergreen trees;
 - e. Any combination of a-d above.

Such screening will be restricted to the perimeter of the relevant parking or service area, and will be a minimum of 6' in height.

6. Entire site is to be kept free and clear of all debris at all times.
7. Outdoor storage of all equipment, raw and processed materials, waste, junk, etc., will be restricted to a designated area not exceeding 10% of the total site area and will be completely enclosed by screening as previously defined. Materials, equipment, etc. will not exceed the height of the screening provided. Corporate vehicles, cranes, and bulldozers, will be exempt from the height restriction.

V. DRAINAGE

1. Methodology and calculation of drainage requirements to be reviewed and approved by Town Engineer and Highway Superintendent.
2. Plans, cross-sections, and specifications for all sewer installations to be reviewed and approved by Town Engineer and Highway Superintendent.
3. Final plans for any retention basins to be reviewed and approved by Town Engineer and Highway Superintendent. Retention basins to be classified in one of two categories: Permanent or Temporary. The following standards shall apply to each category:
 - a. Permanent - such facility shall maintain a minimum permanent water depth of 3'0" and be appropriately landscaped along the perimeter. The Town Engineer and Highway Superintendent will review and approve all plans and locations of such facilities to ensure that stagnation, insect breeding and other similar deleterious side effects will not occur;
 - b. Temporary - such facility shall be designed so that all storm water shall be discharged within 36 hours of collection. Plans and locations to be reviewed by the Town Engineer and Highway Superintendent.

4. Front yard drainage.
 - a. All drainage shall be piped and enclosed to the specifications and standards of the Town Ordinances.
5. Rear yard drainage.
 - a. Open drainage
 1. Maximum permitted depth of the open drainage is unlimited.
 2. a. Maximum slope permitted without bank stabilizer 3 on 1 (three (3) foot slope for every one (1) foot in ditch depth).
 - b. Maximum slope permitted using a bank stabilizer (ie: rip-rap, vegetation such as crown vetch) 2 on 1 (two (2) foot slope for every one (1) foot in ditch depth).
 - b. Enclosed drainage
 1. Enclosed drainage and curbing shall be provided in lieu of open drainage.
6. Side yard drainage shall be enclosed.

VIII. UTILITIES

1. Utility services shall be located underground in accordance with the requirements of the respective Utility Companies.

VII. SIGNS

1. No rotating, moving, flashing or blinking signs will be allowed.
2. One primary corporate identification sign per lot will be allowed. Such sign shall be located either directly on the building or in the front yard set at a minimum of 25' setback from the right-of-way. If located directly on the building, such sign shall not project above the roof line and shall be set flush along the building facade. If located in the front yard, such sign shall not exceed 5'0" in height. A maximum area of 120 sq. ft. will be allowed for such signs.
3. In the case of multiple tenants in a single building, an additional 16 sq. ft. per tenant shall be allowed.
4. Supplementary signs identifying features such as internal site circulation, parking, service entrances, etc. shall be allowed pending review and approval of their number and location by the Review Board. Such signs shall not exceed 16 sq. ft. in area, and when free-standing shall not exceed 4'6" in height above grade.

5. Signs painted directly on walls are prohibited.
6. One sign advertising sale/lease of space shall be allowed per lot. Such sign shall not exceed 32 sq. ft. in area, and be located in conformance with the section regulating the primary identification sign.
7. Signs shall have a single uniform background color and single uniform color for all lettering. All multi-colored (ie: three or more colors) signs are prohibited, with the exception of including a corporate symbol or logo pending review and approval by the Review Board.

VIII. BUILDING DESIGN

1. Innovative and tasteful building design is encouraged.
2. Facade materials will not be limited with the exception of steel and/or aluminum panel facades which are prohibited.

IX. LIGHTING

1. Height, placement, type and intensity of exterior lighting to be consistent throughout the project site.
2. Lighting will be directed so as not to illuminate adjacent parcels.
3. All illuminated signs shall be either internally illuminated or illuminated from concealed sources.
4. For publicly-dedicated roads, recommended lighting is as follows:
 - a. Illumination to be provided by 250-watt high-pressure sodium I.E.S. Type IV distribution pattern luminaires, mounted on 30'-high standards spaced 100' on alternate sides of the roadway, maintaining a minimum level of illumination of one footcandle on pavement.



Dear Mr. Merritt,

I have reviewed the cost figures for converting all the Town of Cheektowaga's gas street light fixtures and standards to electric light fixtures and standards.

In our Town we have a total of 35 streets which are lighted by 535 gas street lights. On these 35 streets, we have a total of 1188 residents who must pay for any conversion cost.

This conversion cost per resident would be \$575.75.

Cost to convert gas lights to electric would be as follows:

A). Gas light removal	\$ 200.00 per standard
B). To install electric light	\$ 950.00 per standard
C). Wiring and conduit from back lot to front	\$ 750.00 per standard
	<u>\$1,900.00 cost per standard</u>

When installing electric light we would require 1/3 less fixtures and standards, totaling an installation of 360 light fixtures and standards.

Dear Mr. Matot:

In response to your request for the cost involved to replace gas street lights with electric lights. The cost projected will be to install the electric street lights in accordance with the Town of Cheektowaga specifications for new subdivision street light installation.

As we discussed, you can take about two thirds (2/3) of the existing gas lights as the number of electric lights that will be needed to replace them. To install one eighteen foot fiberglass pole with a 70 watt high pressure sodium McGraw-Edison post top fixture the estimated cost is \$950.00 per installation. To install 150 feet of underground conductors in conduit the estimated cost is \$750.00 per installation. (As the existing poles are on the back lot lines, it is my estimation that each installation will need 150 feet of underground.)

The costs and number of lights necessary could vary greatly due to field conditions as all the streets with gas lights are ten to fifteen years old.







GARBAGE, RUBBISH AND REFUSE COLLECTION ORDINANCE

RESOLVED that Section 3 of the Garbage, Rubbish and Refuse Collection Ordinance of the Town of Cheektowaga, entitled "Definitions", be amended as follows:

1. The following definitions shall be added:

NON-RECYCLABLE REFUSE -- All plastic containers, rags, sweepings, straw, dirt, waste paper, and such other non-recyclable refuse as may result from ordinary housekeeping pursuits, leaves, tree trimmings, hedge clippings and similar materials, except sewage, liquid waste, ashes, and commercial and industrial non-recyclable refuse.

RECYCLABLE REFUSE -- Clean metal food containers and cans; glass food containers and bottles with metal rings and tops removed; discarded newspapers, magazines, cardboard and flat papers.

2. The definition entitled "REFUSE" shall be repealed in its entirety.
3. The definition "RUBBISH" shall be amended as follows:

RUBBISH -- Includes garbage, non-recyclable refuse and recyclable refuse.

RESOLVED that Section 6 of said ordinance, entitled "Separation; preparation" be amended to read as follows:

- A. Separation of garbage, non-recyclable refuse and recyclable refuse.

1. Garbage, non-recyclable refuse and recyclable refuse shall be placed and maintained separately.

2. Recyclable refuse shall be further separated into three categories:

- (1) Metal food containers and cans.
- (2) Glass containers and bottles.
- (3) Newspapers, magazines, cardboard and flat papers.

B. Preparation of garbage, non-recyclable refuse and recyclable refuse.

(2) All non-recyclable and recyclable refuse shall be thoroughly drained of liquid before being deposited for collection.

(3) Non-recyclable refuse consisting of empty boxes, crates, cartons, shrubbery cuttings, tree trimmings, hedge clippings, wood and other unwieldy objects shall be broken up or cut and tied into compact bundles no longer than five (5) feet in length and no heavier than fifty (50) pounds in weight, so as to be easily handled by one (1) person. Protruding nails, glass and other sharp metal objects that might inflict bodily harm to sanitation personnel, contracted personnel or residents of the town shall be removed from all such refuse prior to bundling as aforesaid.

A new subsection B. (4) shall be added to read as follows:

(4) Recyclable refuse consisting of newspapers, magazines, cardboard and flat papers shall be separated from other recyclable refuse, and shall be securely tied into compact bundles no longer than five (5) feet in length and no heavier than fifty (50) pounds in weight.

Subsection B. (4) shall be renumbered B. (5).

Subsection B. (5) shall be renumbered B. (6).

Subsection B. (6) shall be renumbered B. (7).

RESOLVED that the phrase "non-recyclable or recyclable refuse" shall be substituted in all sections where the phrase "refuse" is found in the existing Garbage, Refuse and Rubbish Collection Ordinance. Attached for your consideration is a resolution to approve Change Orders #3 and #4 against the above subject project for work as directed by the resident engineer and approved by the Town. These are the final claims on the project.

Change Order #3 - Add \$15,369.65

Two (2) major park areas were created in the area of the project by installing Town supplied culvert material, spreading available fill, acquiring topsoil and seeding as directed by the Town Engineer and authorized by the Town. This included 78 square yards of additional pavement at deteriorated areas at a cost of \$1,022.25, 354 square yards of additional sidewalk at deteriorated areas at a cost of \$5,837.40 and the labor and material to create the park area at \$8,510.00. All additional charges are at unit bid prices.

Change Order #4 - Add \$6,242.00

This Change Order is the final adjustment in minuses and pluses of material used on the total project at unit bid prices. The major items of increase were additional grouted rip rap (\$2,520.00), 8 yards of concrete to encase a sanitary sewer (\$1,200.00), pavement replacement (\$1,100.00) and a reduction in pipe (-\$78.00).

Support data is on file in the Engineering Department as part of these Change Orders. The total cost of Change Orders #3 and #4 is \$21,611.65.




