

Sierra Research Division of L.T.V. Aerospace and Defense Company has expanded its manufacturing operations at Plant 3 (485 Cayuga Road, Cheektowaga, NY) to just under 700 employees.

Plant traffic flow only permits one way traffic from our main lot. All traffic exits at our driveway at the intersection of Cayuga Road and Applewood Drive. (See Exhibit A)

With the increase in employment at this facility, serious traffic conditions occur at the subject intersection, especially between 4:00 and 5:00 PM:

1. Employees, who get off shift at 4:00 PM, experience up to a 45 minute delay exiting the parking lot.
2. Main arterial traffic on Cayuga Road frequently is forced to stop because of the heavy flow of existing traffic, especially during bad weather.
3. Accidents have occurred both in our lot and on Cayuga Road.

While traffic conditions at this facility are bad now, planned expansion in the next several years could double employment and gravely aggravate risk at this intersection.





Mr. Robert Buczynski and William Flynn, Director of Manufacturing Operations and Security Director respectively of Sierra Research Corp., Cayuga Rd., attended the Commission's January 1985 meeting to request our consideration of a new traffic signal at the above captioned intersection.

Sierra Research, in addition to their engineering office at Cayuga Rd. and Maryvale Dr., leases a large building at the north end of the Airport Industrial complex from the Niagara Frontier Transportation Authority. (see attached sketch)

Their employment level at this building currently is 500 employees, with a total of 1200 employees projected within the next 5 years. Due to different ownership of the buildings and parcels, access to the driveway outlet to the Cayuga and Cleveland Dr. signal is unavailable to Sierra Research employees, leaving the north driveway opposite Applewood Dr. as the only point of ingress and egress.

The Commission's opinion is that the Sierra Research Corp.'s request has merit and is requesting the Town Board to memorialize the Erie County Department of Public Works (owner of Cayuga Rd.) to study the intersection to determine if warrants exist for a traffic signal.

If Erie County will issue a permit for a signal, Sierra Research has indicated they will pay for design, installation, maintenance and power charges for the signal. Correspondence from them regarding this should be forthcoming.

Some data regarding Cayuga Rd. traffic volumes and operational characteristics is available through the ongoing Cheektowaga Traffic Study. Mr. Bryan should have this data.





(a) These amendments shall take effect when properly posted within a reasonable time except those parts, if any, which are subject to approval under Section 1684 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.

(b) Any part or parts of these amendments which are subject to approval under Section 1684 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the

State of New York shall take effect from and after the day on which approval in writing is received from the New York State Traffic Commission.

Section 3. Territorial Application.

These amendments shall apply to all of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York outside of the Villages of Depew and Sloan.

Section 4. Publication

That these amendments to the Traffic Ordinance shall be entered in the minutes of this Town Board and shall be published in the CHEEKTOWAGA TIMES a newspaper published in this Town and affidavits of such publication shall be filed with the Town Clerk and the Town Clerk shall likewise enter in the Ordinance Book a copy of said amendments specifying the date of adoption thereof.
