WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to amend the "Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York" as set forth in the attached sheet, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

ARTICLE I - GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1-60 LANDSCAPING REGULATIONS

1-61 INTENT

It is the purpose and intent of this section to:

1-61.1 Protect and promote the public health, safety and general welfare by requiring the landscaping of all nonresidential developments, including parking areas and incorporating said landscaping as an integral part of the entire development.

1-61.2 Establish minimum standards and criteria for the landscaping of all nonresidential developments, to discourage the unnecessary clearing and disturbing of land so as to preserve the natural and existing growth of flora and to replace removed flora or plant new flora indigenous to the Western New York region.

1-61.3 Reduce the effects of wind and air turbulence, heat and noise and the glare of automobile lights.

1-61.4 Provide unpaved areas for the absorption of surface waters.

1-61.5 Reduce the level of carbon dioxide and return pure oxygen to the atmosphere.

1-61.6 Prevent soil erosion.

1-61.7 Provide shade.

1-61.8 Conserve and stabilize property values and to otherwise facilitate the creation of a convenient, attractive and harmonious community.

1-61.9 Create attractive buffers between the street right-of-way and the property line.

1-61.10 Relieve the blighting appearance of parking areas.

1-61.11 Generally preserve a healthful and pleasant environment through the use of landscaping for privacy and screening adjacent uses.

1-62 Definitions

1-62.1 Landscape area - the area required or permitted under this section to be devoted to landscaping.

1-62.2 Parking area - the off-street parking area and loading and unloading area required by Article V of this ordinance.

1-63 General Provisions

1-63.1 Developments of attached dwelling units in the RA, RC, C and CM Districts and all nonresidential developments otherwise subject to development plan review shall meet the requirements of this section. A landscape plan pursuant to Section 1-64 shall be submitted to the Town Planning Board and recommended for approval to the Town Board as a part of the review procedure.

1-63.2 The landscape plan shall be drawn to scale, including dimensions and distances, and shall clearly delineate existing and proposed structures, uses, parking area, access aisles, drainage pattern and the location, size and description of all landscape materials existing and proposed, including all trees and shrubs, and including those existing plant materials that are to be removed and such other information as may be required by the Planning Board.

#### 1-64 Standards and Criteria

1-64.1 Each development which is subject to the provisions of this ordinance shall provide for a landscape area which is not less than fifteen percent (15%) of the total area of the development. Parking areas designed for twenty five (25) or more cars shall reserve five percent (5%) of said area for landscaping.

1-64.2 A landscaped area at least ten (10) feet wide shall be provided along the perimeter of a parking area.

1-64.3 Notwithstanding anything contained in Section 5-320 to the contrary, front yards, to a minimum of twenty five (25) feet, shall be landscaped and parking shall be prohibited in said area. The Planning Board reserves the right to recommend relief from this requirement where a landscape plan provides an adequate buffer from front yard parking.

1-64.4 Vegetation shall be compatible with soil conditions on the development site and the regional climate.

1-64.5 Existing natural features and vegetation shall be preserved and incorporated in the landscaped area wherever possible.

1-64.6 The primary emphasis of the landscape treatment shall be on trees. Shrubbery, hedges, grass and other vegetation are to be used to compliment the use of trees but shall not be the sole contribution to the landscape treatment.

1-64.7 The interior dimensions of any landscaped area or median shall be designed in accordance with the American Association of Nurserymen standards for planting bed size to protect the plant materials planted therein and insure proper growth.

1-64.8 All deciduous trees planted shall have a minimum caliper of two and one-half (2 1/2) inches, measured six (6) inches above the ground. All coniferous trees shall have a minimum height of five (5) feet above the finished grade.

1-64.9 Plastic or other types of artificial plantings or vegetation shall not be permitted.

#### 1-65 Existing and New Development

Existing development in all Districts completed prior to the enactment of this ordinance that may require a rezoning, a change in use, or building permit to expand or modernize shall comply with the requirements of Sections 1-64.1 through 1-64.9 inclusive. New developments shall be required to have landscaping in place and completed prior to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy. In the event seasonal conditions prevent completion of the required landscaping, until the following planting season, the Planning Board shall set a completion date and the owner shall post a certified check in the amount of 100% of the cost of the landscaping as verified by a Landscape Architect. Said certified check shall be made payable to the Town of Cheektowaga Town Clerk and shall be redemable after completion and approval of said landscaping work by the stated completion date. In the event the landscaping plan is not completed by the prescribed date, the owner shall forfeit the deposited amount and the Town shall authorize installation of said landscaping.

#### 1-66 Maintenance and Enforcement.

All landscaped areas required and/or permitted by this section shall be maintained and preserved according to the plan as originally approved. Violations of Section 1-60 shall be governed by Section 8-10 of this Zoning Ordinance.

SECTION 1-60  
LANDSCAPING REGULATIONS**

**1-61 Intent**

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1-62.2 Parking area — the off-street parking area and loading and unloading area required by Article V of this ordinance

**1-63 General Provisions**

1-63.1 Developments of attached dwelling units in the RA, TC, C and CM Districts and all nonresidential developments otherwise subject to development plan review shall meet the requirements of this section. A landscape plan pursuant to Section 1-64 shall be submitted to the Town Planning Board and recommended for approval to the Town Board as a part of the review procedure.

1-63.2 The landscape plan shall be drawn to scale, including dimensions and distances, and shall clearly delineate existing and proposed structures, uses, parking area, access aisles, drainage pattern and the location, size and description of all landscape materials existing and proposed, including all trees and shrubs, and including those existing plant materials that are to be removed and such other information as may be required by the Planning Board.

**1-64 Standards and Criteria**

1-64.1 Each development which is subject to the provisions of this ordinance shall provide for a landscape area which is not less than fifteen percent (15%) of the total area of the development. Parking areas designed for twenty five (25) or more cars shall reserve five percent (5%) of said area for landscaping.

1-64.2 A landscaped area at least ten (10) feet wide shall be provided along the perimeter of a parking area.

1-64.3 Notwithstanding anything containing in Section 5-320 to the contrary, front yards, to a minimum of twenty five (25) feet, shall be landscaped and parking shall be prohibited in said area. The Planning Board reserves the right to recommend relief from this requirement where a landscape plan provides an adequate buffer from front yard parking.

1-64.4 Vegetation shall be compatible with soil conditions on the development site and the regional climate.

1-64.5 Existing natural features and vegetation shall be preserved and incorporated in the landscaped area wherever possible.

1-64.6 The primary emphasis of the landscape treatment shall be on trees. Shrubbery, hedges, grass and other vegetation are to be used to compliment the use of trees but shall not be the sole contribution to the landscape treatment.

1-64.7 The interior dimensions of any landscaped area or median shall be designed in accordance with the American Association of Nurserymen standards for planting bed size to protect the plant materials planted therein and insure proper growth.

1-64.8 All deciduous trees planted shall have a minimum caliper of two and one-half (2-1/2) inches, measured six (6) inches above the ground. All coniferous trees shall have a minimum height of five (5) feet above the finished grade.

1-64.9 Plastic or other types of artificial plantings or vegetation shall not be permitted.

**1-65 Existing and New Development**

Existing development in all Districts completed prior to the enactment of this ordinance that may require a rezoning, a change in use, or building permit to expand or modernize shall comply with the requirements of Sections 1-64.1 through 1-64.9 inclusive. New developments shall be required to have landscaping in place and completed prior to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy. In the event seasonal conditions prevent completion of the required landscaping, until the following planting season, the Planning Board shall set a completion date and the owner shall post a certified check in the amount of 100% of the cost of the landscaping as verified by a Landscape Architect. Said certified check shall be made payable to the Town of Cheektowaga Town Clerk and shall be redeemable after completion and approval of said landscaping work by the stated completion date. In the event the landscaping plan is not completed by the prescribed date, the owner shall forfeit the deposited amount and the Town shall authorize installation of said landscaping.

**1-66 Maintenance and Enforcement**

All landscaped areas required and/or permitted by this section shall be maintained and preserved according to the plan as originally approved. Violations of Section 1-60 shall be governed by Section 8-10 of this Zoning Ordinance.

A LOCAL LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE COMPILATION, RENUMBERING AND TABULATION OF THE LOCAL LAWS, ORDINANCES AND CERTAIN RESOLUTIONS OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga as follows:

ARTICLE I  
Adoption of Code

§ 1-1. Legislative intent.

The local laws, ordinances and resolutions of the Town of Cheektowaga, referred to in § 1-2 of this local law shall be known collectively as the "Code of the Town of Cheektowaga," and the various parts and sections of such local laws, ordinances and resolutions shall be distributed and designated as provided and set forth in § 1-2 of this local law.

§ 1-2. Distribution of local laws, ordinances and resolutions.

§ 1-3. Repeal of local laws, ordinances and resolutions not contained in Code.

All local laws, ordinances and resolutions of a general and permanent nature adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in force on the date of the adoption of this local law and not cited in the table in § 1-2 hereof are hereby repealed as of the effective date of this local law, except as hereinafter provided.

§ 1-4. Local laws, ordinances and resolutions saved from repeal; matters not affected by repeal.

The repeal of local laws and ordinances provided for in § 1-3 of this local law shall not affect the following classes of local laws, ordinances, resolutions, rights and obligations, which are hereby expressly saved from repeal:

- A. Any local law, ordinance or resolution adopted subsequent to September 16, 1985.
- B. Any right or liability established, accrued or incurred under any legislative provision of the Town of Cheektowaga prior to the effective date of this local law or any action or proceeding brought for the enforcement of such right or liability.
- C. An offense or act committed or done before the effective date of this local law in violation of any legislative provision of the Town of Cheektowaga or any penalty, punishment or forfeiture which may result therefrom.
- D. Any prosecution, indictment, action, suit or other proceeding pending or any judgment rendered prior to the effective date of this local law and brought pursuant to any legislative provision of the Town of Cheektowaga.
- E. Any franchise, license, right, easement or privilege heretofore granted or conferred by the Town of Cheektowaga.
- F. Any local law, ordinance or resolution of the Town of Cheektowaga providing for the laying out, opening, altering, widening, relocating, straightening, establishing grade, changing name, improvement, acceptance or vacation of any right-of-way, easement, street, road, highway, park or other public place within the Town of Cheektowaga or any portion thereof.
- G. Any ordinance or resolution of the Town of Cheektowaga appropriating money or transferring funds, promising or guaranteeing the payment of money or authorizing the issuance and delivery of any bond of the Town of Cheektowaga, or other instruments or evidence of the town's indebtedness.
- H. Local laws, ordinances or resolutions authorizing the purchase, sale, lease or transfer of property, or any lawful contract or obligation.
- I. The levy or imposition of special assessments or charges.
- J. The dedication of property.
- K. Any local laws, ordinances or resolutions relating to salaries.
- L. Any resolution or ordinance establishing special districts, including election, sewer, water and library districts.
- M. Any local law, ordinance or resolution establishing or amending any map.
- N. The ordinance adopted August 4, 1975 adopting the Fire Prevention Code by reference.
- O. The local law adopted May 21, 1984 relating to Sewer Use.

§ 1-5. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, Article or part of this local law or of any local law, ordinance or resolution cited in the table in § 1-2 hereof shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section, Article or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

§ 1-6. Copies of Code on file.

Three (3) copies of the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga, in loose-leaf form, have been filed in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga and shall remain there for use and examination by the public until final action is taken on this local law; and if this local law shall be adopted, such copies shall be certified to by the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga by impressing thereon the seal of the Town of Cheektowaga, and such certified copies shall remain on file in the office of said Town Clerk to be made available to persons desiring to examine the same during all times while the said Code is in effect.

§ 1-7. Amendments to Code.

Any and all additions, deletions, amendments or supplements to any of the local laws, ordinances and resolutions known collectively as the "Code of the Town of Cheektowaga" or any new local laws, ordinances or resolutions, when enacted or adopted in such form as to indicate the intention of the Town Board to be a part thereof, shall be deemed to be incorporated into such Code so that reference to the "Code of the Town of Cheektowaga" shall be understood and intended to include such additions, deletions, amendments or supplements. Whenever such additions, deletions, amendments or supplements to the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga shall be enacted or adopted, they shall thereafter be printed and, as provided hereunder, inserted in the loose-leaf book containing said Code, as amendments and supplements thereto.

§ 1-8. Code book to be kept up-to-date.

It shall be the duty of the Town Clerk or someone authorized and directed by the Town Clerk to keep up-to-date the certified copies of the book containing the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga required to be filed in the office of the Town Clerk for the use of the public. All changes in said Code and all local laws, ordinances and resolutions adopted by the Town Board subsequent to the enactment of this local law in such form as to indicate the intention of said Town Board to be a part of said Code shall, when finally enacted or adopted, be included therein by temporary attachment of copies of such changes or local laws, ordinances or resolutions until such changes or local laws, ordinances or resolutions are printed as supplements to said Code book, at which time such supplements shall be inserted therein.

§ 1-9. Sale of Code book; supplementation.

Copies of the Code book containing the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga may be purchased from the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga upon the payment of a fee to be set by resolution of the Town Board, which may also arrange by resolution for procedures for the periodic supplementation thereof.

§ 1-10. Publication; filing.

The Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, pursuant to law, shall cause to be published, in the manner required, an abstract of this local law in the official newspaper of the town. A copy of the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga and the whole text maintained in the office of the Town Clerk for inspection by the public at all times during regular office hours. The enactment and application of this local law, coupled with the availability of a copy of the Code for inspection by the public, shall be deemed, held and considered to be due and legal publication of all provisions of the Code for all purposes.

§ 1-11. Penalties for offenses.

Any person who, without authorization from the Town Clerk, changes or amends, by additions or deletions, any part or portion of the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga or who alters or tampers with such Code in any manner whatsoever which will cause the legislation of the Town of Cheektowaga to be misrepresented thereby, or who violates any other provision of this local law shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of not more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.) or imprisonment for a term of not more than fifteen (15) days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

§ 1-12. Incorporation of provisions into Code.

The provisions of this local law are hereby made Chapter 1 of the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga, to be entitled "General Provisions, Article I, Adoption of Code," and the sections of this local law shall be numbered §§ 1-1 to 1-13, inclusive.

§ 1-13. When effective.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of the State of New York.

A LOCAL LAW INCREASING VETERANS' REAL PROPERTY TAX  
EXEMPTIONS FOR TOWN TAXES IN THE SAME PROPORTION AS  
THE TOTAL ASSESSED VALUE INCREASES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the authority of Subdivision 5.(a) of Section 458 of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga hereby provides for the prorating of veterans' real property tax exemptions should property be assessed at full value.

Section 2. If the ratio between the exemption granted under Section 458 of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York and the total assessed value of the real property in the Town for which such exemption has been granted increases due only to a full value assessment in the Town, the amount of exemption heretofore or hereafter granted under said Section 458 shall increase in such subsequent year in the same proportion as the total assessed value has been increased.

Section 3. This local law shall take effect immediately upon the application of the full value assessments generated by Erie County's revaluation program.


Dear Mr. Bryan:

Based on your needs and desires to have the north western portion of the Town of Cheektowaga mapped photogrammetrically at a scale of 1" = 100' with 2' contour intervals, Tallamy, VanKuren, Gertis and Associates estimates that this would encompass about 5880 acres of mapping. Based on your present standard sheet size, we calculate that the mapping would involve forty (40) sheets covering about 147 acres per sheet. Based on the Town ordering four (4) mapped contiguous sheets at a time; we propose to prepare the final maps, ink on mylar, at two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) per sheet. This quotation is based on the Town ordering the forty (40) standard size mapped sheets in not longer than a three (3) year time frame. Invoicing for this mapping effort would be rendered upon delivery of the individual maps ordered and the same would become payable within thirty (30) days of the date of invoicing.

If the fees and minimum mapping schedule is acceptable to the Town, the signing and returning of the enclosed copy will constitute an executed agreement and authorization to proceed with the preliminary mapping effort.



The NFTA agrees during the term of this Agreement to make every reasonable attempt to provide primary Explosive Detection K-9 team support at the Airport and to call upon the Town for back-up support only in the event of emergency or exceptional circumstances. It is understood that the Town will not be called upon by the NFTA to fill in for the NFTA merely because of manpower shortages experienced by the NFTA.

3. The Town may terminate this Agreement, at its option:
- a. at any time during the term hereof; or
  - b. at such time as the Town's Explosive Detection K-9 team is no longer certified by the FAA and/or U.S. Air Force.

The Town shall make every reasonable effort to give the NFTA notice of its termination of this Agreement.

## Grant Agreement

This Grant Agreement is made by and between the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the  
Town of Cheektowaga (the Grantee) pursuant to the authority of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (Public Law 93-383), as amended. The Grantee's submissions for Title I assistance and the HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 570 (as now in effect and as may be amended from time to time), which are incorporated by reference, together with the HUD Funding Approval Form 7082 and any special conditions, which are hereto attached, constitute part of the Agreement.

In reliance upon and in consideration of the mutual representations and obligations hereunder, HUD and the Grantee agree as follows:

Subject to the provisions of this Grant Agreement, HUD will make the funding assistance for Fiscal Year 19 85 specified in the attached HUD Funding Approval Form 7082 available to the Grantee upon execution of the Agreement by the parties. The obligation and utilization of the funding assistance provided is subject to the requirements of the regulations and any special conditions set forth in the HUD Funding Approval Form 7082, including the requirement for a release of funds by HUD under the Environmental Review Procedures at 24 CFR Part 58 for any activities requiring such release.

The Grantee agrees to comply with all applicable requirements of Titles II and III of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 (42 U.S.C. 4601) as specified in regulations issued by the Secretary and published in 24 CFR Part 42.

The LESSEE shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the LESSOR, its agents and employees, from and against any and all liability for losses, damages, or expenses which the LESSOR may suffer or for which the LESSOR may be held liable by reason of bodily injury including death, to any person or persons, or by reason of damage to or destruction of any property, including loss of use thereof arising out of or in any manner connected with the use of said premises by the LESSEE directly or indirectly whether or not such injury or damage be attributed or claimed to be attributed to the negligence of the LESSOR, its agents, servants or employees, or otherwise.

4. That the LESSEE is to use said premises only for storage of and as a parking lot for motor vehicles, and for ingress and egress to

the LESSEE's property. LESSEE shall prepare and maintain the premises for such purpose at its own expense and is to use the premises for no other purpose without the written consent of the LESSOR.

5. LESSEE shall observe and comply with all laws, ordinances, orders, rules and regulations of any Federal, State, County or Municipal authorities applicable to the demised premises and to the business conducted by the LESSEE in the demised premises. LESSEE shall not permit anything to be done in said premises, or keep anything therein, which will increase the rate of insurance premiums on the improvements, or any part thereof, or on property kept therein, or which will interfere with the rights of other lessees, or conflict with the regulations of the Fire Department or with any insurance policy upon the demised premises or any part thereof. LOCAL LAW NO. 4 - 1985

A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF THE YEAR 1985 OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga as follows:

- Local Law No. 2 of the Year 1985 of the Town of Cheektowaga shall be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE I  
Adoption of Code

§ 1-1. Legislative intent.

§ 1-3. Repeal of local laws, ordinances and resolutions not contained in Code.

All local laws, ordinances and resolutions of a general and permanent nature adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in force on the date of the adoption of this local law and not cited in the table in § 1-2 hereof are hereby repealed as of the effective date of this local law, except as hereinafter provided.

§ 1-4. Local laws, ordinances and resolutions saved from repeal; matters not affected by repeal.

The repeal of local laws and ordinances provided for in § 1-3 of this local law shall not affect the following classes of local laws, ordinances, resolutions, rights and obligations, which are hereby expressly saved from repeal:

- A. Any local law, ordinance or resolution adopted subsequent to September 16, 1985.
- B. Any right or liability established, accrued or incurred under any legislative provision of the Town of Cheektowaga prior to the effective date of this local law or any action or proceeding brought for the enforcement of such right or liability.
- C. An offense or act committed or done before the effective date of this local law in violation of any legislative provision of the Town of Cheektowaga or any penalty, punishment or forfeiture which may result therefrom.
- D. Any prosecution, indictment, action, suit or other proceeding pending or any judgment rendered prior to the effective date of this local law and brought pursuant to any legislative provision of the Town of Cheektowaga.
- E. Any franchise, license, right, easement or privilege heretofore granted or conferred by the Town of Cheektowaga.
- F. Any local law, ordinance or resolution of the Town of Cheektowaga providing for the laying out, opening, altering, widening, relocating, straightening, establishing grade, changing name, improvement, acceptance or vacation of any right-of-way, easement, street, road, highway, park or other public place within the Town of Cheektowaga or any portion thereof.
- G. Any ordinance or resolution of the Town of Cheektowaga appropriating money or transferring funds, promising or guaranteeing the payment of money or authorizing the issuance and delivery of any bond of the Town of Cheektowaga, or other instruments or evidence of the town's indebtedness.
- H. Local laws, ordinances or resolutions authorizing the purchase, sale, lease or transfer of property, or any lawful contract or obligation.
- I. The levy or imposition of special assessments or charges.
- J. The dedication of property.
- K. Any local laws, ordinances or resolutions relating to salaries.
- L. Any resolution or ordinance establishing special districts, including election, sewer, water and library districts.
- M. Any local law, ordinance or resolution establishing or amending any map.
- N. The ordinance adopted August 4, 1975 adopting the Fire Prevention Code by reference.
- O. The local law adopted May 21, 1984 relating to Sewer Use.

§ 1-5. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, Article or part of this local law or of any local law, ordinance or resolution cited in the table in § 1-2 hereof shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section, Article or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

§ 1-6. Copies of Code on file.

Three (3) copies of the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga, in loose-leaf form, have been filed in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga and shall remain there for use and examination by the public until final action is taken on this local law; and if this local law shall be adopted, such copies shall be certified to by the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga by impressing thereon the seal of the Town of Cheektowaga, and such certified copies shall remain on file in the office of said Town Clerk to be made available to persons desiring to examine the same during all times while the said Code is in effect.

§ 1-7. Amendments to Code.

Any and all additions, deletions, amendments or supplements to any of the local laws, ordinances and resolutions known collectively as the "Code of the Town of Cheektowaga" or any new local laws, ordinances or resolutions, when enacted or adopted in such form as to indicate the intention of the Town Board to be a part thereof, shall be deemed to be incorporated into such Code so that reference to the "Code of the Town of Cheektowaga" shall be understood and intended to include such additions, deletions, amendments or supplements. Whenever such additions, deletions, amendments or supplements to the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga shall be enacted or adopted, they shall thereafter be printed and, as provided hereunder, inserted in the loose-leaf book containing said Code, as amendments and supplements thereto.

§ 1-8. Code book to be kept up-to-date.

It shall be the duty of the Town Clerk or someone authorized and directed by the Town Clerk to keep up-to-date the certified copies of the book containing the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga required to be filed in the office of the Town Clerk for the use of the public. All changes in said Code and all local laws, ordinances and resolutions adopted by the Town Board subsequent to the enactment of this local law in such form as to indicate the intention of said Town Board to be a part of said Code shall, when finally enacted or adopted, be included therein by temporary attachment of copies of such changes or local laws, ordinances or resolutions until such changes or local laws, ordinances or resolutions are printed as supplements to said Code book, at which time such supplements shall be inserted therein.

§ 1-9. Sale of Code book; supplementation.

Copies of the Code book containing the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga may be purchased from the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga upon the payment of a fee to be set by resolution of the Town Board, which may also arrange by resolution for procedures for the periodic supplementation thereof.

§ 1-10. Publication; filing.

this  
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The Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, pursuant to law, shall cause to be published, in the manner required, an abstract of this local law in the official newspaper of the town. A copy of the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga and the whole text maintained in the office of the Town Clerk for inspection by the public at all times during regular office hours. The enactment and application of this local law, coupled with the availability of a copy of the Code for inspection by the public, shall be deemed, held and considered to be due and legal publication of all provisions of the Code for all purposes.

§ 1-11. Penalties for offenses.

Any person who, without authorization from the Town Clerk, changes or amends, by additions or deletions, any part or portion of the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga or who alters or tampers with such Code in any manner whatsoever which will cause the legislation of the Town of Cheektowaga to be misrepresented thereby, or who violates any other provision of this local law shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of not more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.) or imprisonment for a term of not more than fifteen (15) days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

§ 1-12. Incorporation of provisions into Code.

The provisions of this local law are hereby made Chapter 1 of the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga, to be entitled "General Provisions, Article I, Adoption of Code," and the sections of this local law shall be numbered §§ 1-1 to 1-13, inclusive.

§ 1-13. When effective.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of the State of New York.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA

AND

THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA EMPLOYEES' ASSOCIATION

---

In order to establish a successor agreement between the Town of Cheektowaga and the Town of Cheektowaga Employees' Association, for the contract period January 1, 1986 through December 31, 1988, the parties agree to adopt the existing agreement between the parties, except for the following modifications:

1.) Amend the first sentence of the first paragraph of the Agreement to read, "THIS AGREEMENT is made this 16th day of December, 1985, ....."

2.) Amend ARTICLE 5 HOURS OF WORK, Section 5.02 - Work Week as follows:

Delete all after "4:30 P.M."

3.) Amend Section 5.09 - Inclement Weather as follows:

Add to first sentence after "regularly schedule time", "unless notified that the department is closed, such closing will be made by radio announcement, as per Section 5.10." "If the department is not closed, an employee who is unable to report to work on time but does report by 12:00 Noon, shall be paid as if he reported to work on time." (The rest remains).

4.) Change Section 5.10 - Lunch Periods to Section 5.12.

5.) Add a New Section 5.10 - Closing of Departments, to read as follows:

"The Town Supervisor, due to inclement weather, may shut down any or all departments. The closing of the department shall mean that no employee shall report to work. Any employee whose department has been shut down by inclement weather conditions shall have the option of using a sick or personal day. If he has no accrued sick or personal days, he may use a vacation day."

"If the department is closed for three (3) consecutive work days by order of the Supervisor, one (1) 'Act of God' day (eight [8] hours) will be allowed each employee."

6.) Add a New Section 5.11 - Inclement Weather Call In, to read as follows:

"After the Town Supervisor has declared an inclement weather condition, and after all department full-time employees have been utilized, if it becomes necessary to utilize additional full-time employees from other departments, employees will be called in according to a town-wide seniority list on the basis of their experience and demonstrated ability to operate related equipment. Any employee who works in another department during an emergency situation will be charged with such overtime."

7.) Amend ARTICLE 7 VACATIONS, Section 7.01 - Choice of Vacation Period, paragraph (b) to read as follows:

"Vacations shall be granted at the time requested by the employee, provided that such request is not made prior to January 1st, or later than February 28/29.....".





This signal shall function with a conflict monitor to prevent adjacent or conflicting GREEN indications, and will be revised to conform with future traffic requirements.

This signal shall not cause delay detrimental to safe and efficient traffic flow on Cayuga (CR 245), and will be timed to insure safe and efficient traffic flow on Cayuga (CR 245). This signal shall be coordinated with the existing Cleveland (CR 141) signal to safely and efficiently move Cayuga (CR 245) traffic during high volume periods by means of a time base coordination device installation at Applewood (Town Highway), and at Cleveland (CR 141).

3. All signals shall be suspended centrally over the pavement, with a minimum clearance of 15' TO 17'.
4. All signs, signals or markings covered by this permit shall conform to the standards and future revisions of the New York State Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices.
5. The work authorized by this permit shall be performed under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Deputy Commissioner of Public Works-Highways of Erie County.
6. Traffic shall be maintained; and traffic and public shall be properly protected at all times during the progress of the work authorized by this permit.
7. All portions of the highway or street which may be disturbed during the progress of the work authorized by this permit shall be restored to their original condition.

- 8. The applicant hereby agrees that it will keep insured during the performance of the above described work, such employees as are required to be insured under the provisions of Chapter 41 of the Laws of 1914 and acts amendatory thereof, known as the Workmen's Compensation Law.
- 9. The applicant agrees to maintain the sign, signal or marking and any equipment or necessary parts thereof in good condition, and in a manner which will not constitute a hazard to traffic.
- 10. The applicant hereby agrees to hold the County harmless on account of damages of any kind which may arise during the progress of the work authorized by this permit, or by reason thereof, including any damage that may result from failure of signal to operate at any time.
- 11. This permit is revocable at the discretion of the Deputy Commissioner of Public Works - Highways after a hearing and for due cause.


