This could be an overview that includes major initiatives and highlights that were proposed and executed throughout the program year.

During the 2024 program year, there was again, substantial progress in reaching many of our planned activity goals primarily with our Housing Rehabilitation program, Senior Services Programming, Domestic Violence Counseling, Weatherization Program, neighborhood infrastructure improvements, and Housing Counseling Program. Though only 9 units were rehabilitated using CDBG funds an additional 15 units were rehabilitated utilizing HOME funds, for a total of 24 units in the 2024 program year.

In an effort to improve not only the affordable housing stock in the Town of Cheektowaga, but also our low-moderate income neighborhoods, we continued our commitment to preserving, improving, and investing in the quality of our neighborhoods. The 2024 program year, saw completion of the new ADA compliant Alexander Community Center elevator, sidewalk replacement in the Village of Depew, playground improvements at Wrazen Park in the Village of Sloan, tree plantings in the Peach Tree Road neighborhood, and curb replacement on Shanley Street in conjunction with a complete street overhaul by the Town.

Additional gains toward goals were also seen in the Public Services sector through Youth Services and Police Foot Patrols. A total of 27 youth received financial aid to attend the Town of Cheektowaga Summer Day Camp Program and Teen Club Program free of charge. This opportunity provides organized, supervised daily activities for a six-week period during the summer, and eases the cost burden of day-care, enabling parents to pursue employment and attempt to improve their economic status. In addition, we are proud to provide funding to the Cheektowaga Boys & Girls Club, which provides the same organized, supervised daily activities, but after school, throughout the school year. Finally, we were able to provide funding to the Girl Scouts of WNY that sent 8 female Cheektowaga Youth to Camp Seven Hills.

Assess how the jurisdiction’s use of funds, particularly CDBG, addresses the priorities and specific objectives identified in the plan, giving special attention to the highest priority activities identified.

The Town of Cheektowaga’s Annual Plan emphasizes housing, public services, and neighborhood revitalization as primary needs to assist low-moderate income individuals and families. During the 2024 program year, CDBG funding was utilized to create a well-rounded approach to improving the lives our the Town’s low-mod residents. This approach included not only neighborhood improvement projects, and housing rehabilitation loans, but also public services necessary to support one’s financial well-being and quality of life.

Neighborhood improvement projects and housing rehabilitation loans continue to contribute to the enhancement of neighborhoods and elimination of possible blighting influences. An amount of \$389,630.78 was expended on the infrastructure projects mentioned above. In addition, CDBG funds totaling approximately \$260,749.72 were utilized for Housing Rehabilitation projects.

As in past years, in an effort to increase our residents quality of life, CDBG funds were utilized for various public services, including Summer Day Camp Financial Aid, funding to the Cheektowaga Boys & Girls Club, Girl Scouts of WNY, Housing Counseling Services, Fair Housing Education and Counseling, Police Foot Patrols, Domestic Violence Counseling Program, Senior Outreach Services, and Village of Depew Senior Center Operations and Programming.

Narrative

The identified low-moderate targeted neighborhood of Clinton, saw a much-needed complete street overhaul of Shanley Street, with CDBG funds provided to replace severely deteriorated curbs. In addition, the Village of Depew utilized its CDBG funds to replace sidewalks in the vicinity of Fireman’s Park in conjunction with other major park improvements conducted by the Village. Finally the Village of Sloan utilized its CDBG funding to complete a much needed update of all aspects of Wrazen Park, located in the Village.

CDBG funds were also targeted for use as Housing Rehabilitation Loans with the expenditure of NYS Affordable Housing Corporation (AHC) funds as a matching grant where available. NYS AHC funds are utilized in the form of 60% grant funds matched against 40% loan funds (CDBG and HOME) of the total rehab amount. The grant funds were subject to a maximum 10-year forgiveness period and are only repaid if the rehabilitated property is sold before the full forgiveness period has expired.

Leveraging

In the 2023 Program, the Town of Cheektowaga was awarded another \$450,000 grant from the New York State Affordable Housing Corporation to be utilized over the 2023 and 2024 program years. These funds are provided to residents in qualified neighborhoods in the form of a 60% grant matching a 40% loan utilizing HOME and CDBG funds. These grant funds are instrumental in allowing our homeowners to have additional rehab work completed through the program without taking on additional debt in the form of a loan. In addition, these funds serve as a source of the required 25% local Match for HOME funds for the Amherst-Cheektowaga-Tonawanda Consortium.

In an effort to assist a larger number of homeowners, some housing rehabilitation loans require regular monthly loan payments. This allows us to turn funds around quicker, and help a larger number of homeowners with their housing rehab needs.

With the intention of expanding affordable housing opportunities in the Town of Cheektowaga, the Office of Community Development works in collaboration with the Buffalo Erie Niagara Land Improvement Corporation (BENLIC) and University District Community Development Association, Inc. (UDCDA) as a HUD Community Development Housing Organization (CHDO). Program income derived from previous CHDO projects is utilized on new acquisition/rehab/new construction/resale projects.

Finally, the Town of Cheektowaga provides office space, utilities, auto maintenance and fuel, accounting services, legal services, and other services at no cost to the Office of Community and Economic Development, which manages the HUD programs for the Town.

Discuss the difference between goals and outcomes and problems encountered in meeting these goals.

The number of units accomplished in our Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program each year is dependent on factors such as number of applicants, availability of contractors, and the ability of contractors to get the work done, all of which are out of the control of the Town. However, the Town does conduct outreach to obtain applicants and we continue to try alternative methods to get the word out about our programs.

During the 2024 program year, we again, saw an uptick in inquiries for assistance through our Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program. As of the end of the 2024 program year, approximately 200 households were waiting to participate in the program. In addition, our estimated CDBG housing rehabilitation goal

was 25 households, between our HOME and CDBG funds we were able to complete 24 rehabilitation projects, with another 28 in process at the end of the program year.

Based on the outcomes of 2024, and the fact that there is a strong need for Housing Rehabilitation Loans based on the current waiting list, program income from both the CDBG and HOME programs will be focused toward the Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program.

Narrative Information

Families are served through Town of Cheektowaga programs on a first-come, first-served basis and the range of income types varies from year to year. We continue to stress our Mobile Home Rehab Program and Owner-Occupied Rehab Program to reach the poorer homeowners in the Town and our mobile home parks. We have and will again participate in the Senior Star mailing with the Town Assessor’s office to reach our seniors, many of whom are low-income. As previously mentioned we also continue to execute a large variety of outreach measures to ensure we are informing the greatest number of residents in need.

Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

The Town of Cheektowaga is aware that there are people considered homeless living in Cheektowaga. Occasionally, the Cheektowaga Police Department come across people who are living in tents in wooded areas of the Town. Others that the police interact with also identify themselves as being homeless. Although it would be hard to quantify the number of homeless in Cheektowaga, there have been documented incidents where the Police Department has assisted people that they interact with in finding safe housing. Assistance has ranged from transporting these individuals to the Matt Urban Center, to linking them with service providers in the community who can assist with emergency needs, both mental and physical. In addition, the Police Department partners with Endeavor Health Services to provide behavioral health and crisis intervention services. The role of this individual is to not only provide additional expertise to police officers when responding to calls, but to further assist with linking individuals to necessary services, and to follow-up with people who have had interactions with the police to determine what steps can be taken for them to take positive steps forward.

Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

The Town continues to participate in the region's homeless planning strategies and meetings with homeless service agencies. In addition, Town staff in the Office of Community Development continue to collaborate with all regional social service agencies to stay up to date on existing service gaps, and as a result target funding more appropriately.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs

Through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Section 8 Existing and Project-Based Programs, vouchers are provided to low-income renters, thereby reducing their housing costs. This program is administered throughout the County of Erie by Belmont Housing Resources for WNY. In addition, it is our goal through social service agencies receiving CDBG funds, to provide linkages to assistance before shelter is needed.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

The Town offers a variety of programs to assist low-moderate income residents to remain in their primary residence. A variety of counseling services are provided through Housing Opportunities Made Equal, Belmont Housing Resources for WNY, Parachute Credit Counseling, and the Western New York Law Center to address housing needs and make changes to financial conditions to prevent foreclosure and homelessness.

In addition, reducing housing costs can make housing more affordable and thereby prevent homelessness. Community Development Block Grant and HOME Investment Partnership funds have been used to provide low-moderate income homeowners with low or no interest loans to correct minor and major deficiencies and/or code violations on their homes. Using Community Development Block Grant funds, the Town, in cooperation with Supportive Services Corporation, also provides a weatherization program to homeowners for a variety of energy saving improvements. These programs provide low-moderate income homeowners in the Town the funds necessary to make improvements and retain home ownership.

Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)

The Town of Cheektowaga took the first steps towards mitigating restrictive public policy in 2021 by adopting a Comprehensive Plan. The adoption at the time was the first update in more than 25 years within the Town. The plan identified multiple areas of policy investment meant to accomplish two main themes, removing outdated practice and creating contextually sensitive policy. With a goal of having a policy that compliments both the existing built environment and communal need. As noted in previous years, no one set of policy changes will be the exact prescription to rectify aged-policy impacts and the current needs of the community.

However, it would begin breaking down barriers holding back growth, both new and through re-investment. It would also be a start at eroding the impacts of policy that was once strongly rooted and later recognized to be discriminatory practice by nature. Most of which was derived in an era where community division was a strong derivative present across multiple sectors of the housing market. Effects of such prejudice practice are still found in the design of communities across America, with lingering social impacts still prevalent as well.

Since the adoption of the plan, the Town has engaged on multiple fronts to start implementation of this comprehensive plan with no strong policy change established at this time. However, the strongest attempt has been initiated as of 5-14-2025 with the Town filing for a grant application with Erie County (NY). The funding being sought would be used as a local match towards a larger funding source at either the State or Federal level if awarded. This funding would go directly towards the project of enacting a Town wide zoning amendment, which has a foundation in the 2021 Comprehensive Plan. A policy change of this magnitude would not only see a local law be re-written but establish an endless ceiling of impact. As a crucial community catalyst, the tell of the impact of this change will be the level of investment seen by both those crafting the law and the level at which the public engages during its formation.

Additionally, the Town has also furthered two of the previous initiatives noted, both of which are still on-going. The first being the Regional Trail Advancement initiative which saw the Cheektowaga Trails Feasibility Study completed in 2023. Phase 02 of the work would see design completion for extension of the Cheektowaga trail by connection to the Lancaster Heritage Trail and has received multi-municipal support. However, full funding for Phase 02 has yet to be secured at this time. If fruitful, and if funding is secured for both Phase 02 and Phase 03, this would connect multiple neighborhoods regionally via an alternative transportation route, and it would open the opportunity for residents to not be dependent on an automobile. A traditional costly burden that is a need of most residents.

The second initiative was the establishment of affordable housing which is under way and in the permitting process. The Harlem Villa Commons is a 73 residential-unit, mixed-use project that is establishing affordable housing under the Restore NY Grant received by the Town of Cheektowaga. This project is meant to aid residents by not only providing cost effective housing, but to also allow for housing that is within walking distance to nearby amenities and transportation.

Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The Town of Cheektowaga continues to work with the Cheektowaga Community Collaborative to identify unmet needs and identify solutions for our residents. Regular meetings are held to discuss changing community needs and how they can be addressed through the various social service partner agencies.

The Town's housing rehabilitation loan program has funding to address accessibility issues for the elderly or for persons with physical disabilities. Such funds may cover the addition of wheelchair ramps, handicap accessible bathrooms, kitchens, doorways, and/or ingress/egress modifications. 3 of these projects were completed in the 2024 program year.

In the 2024 Program year, the Town of Cheektowaga also saw the ground breaking of Buffalo Veterans Village. Located at 3600 Harlem Road, this project demolished a long-vacant nuisance property to make room for a 90 unit complex that will offer affordable housing for veterans. In addition, on-site comprehensive support services will be provided for residents. Though no CDBG or HOME funds are being contributed, this project is extremely beneficial to the community, residents it will serve, and the immediate surrounding neighborhood.

Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The Town of Cheektowaga continues to take multiple steps toward the elimination of lead-based paint hazards by implementing procedures, including educating recipient homeowners on the dangers of lead-based paint hazards, and its prevention, through onsite distribution of federally approved pamphlets and brochures.

In addition, all residential properties receiving rehabilitation assistance through the CDBG or HOME programs are screened by inspectors as to age of the structure, amount of peeling paint on the property, emergency work status, and whether or not a painted surface will be affected by the proposed rehabilitation work. After screening, a determination is made as to whether the subject property is required to be inspected for lead paint hazards. In most cases, a Risk Assessment is performed.

The hazards identified by the Risk Assessment are incorporated into the work write-up for the project and are addressed by a certified contractor through either interim controls or abatement, depending on the size of the job. Community Development Inspectors have been properly trained in identifying and dealing with lead paint hazards. Contractors participating in the Town's Rehabilitation Loan Program are

required to become certified in order to assure the availability of qualified, trained, and competitive rehabilitation contractors.

During the past fiscal year, the Town of Cheektowaga evaluated, and where necessary, remediated lead contamination in 12 residential structures rehabilitated with CDBG and HOME funds.

Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

It is the Town's belief that in order to reduce the number of poverty-level families, a well-rounded approach must be taken. As a result, the Town utilizes local social service organizations and Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to provide services such as housing and budget counseling, various programs for children, both during the school year, and during summer break, additional police foot patrols, senior services, counseling for domestic violence victims, and tenant/landlord counseling. In addition CDBG and HOME Investment Partnership funds are used to aid in the maintenance of safe and affordable dwelling units.

Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The staff of the Community Development Office are continuously attending trainings, informational workshops, and conferences sponsored by HUD or HUD consultants regarding compliance, reporting, and regulatory issues. Such training opportunities have reinforced the Town's capacity to ensure compliance with program and planning requirements. Staff members have also attended sessions to identify other funds that may be available to supplement HUD funds. In addition, staff attends informational trainings offered by social service partners to better understand the big picture of what is going on in our community.

Finally, open conversations with not only local HUD staff, but also other community development professionals has served to strengthen the Town's compliance capabilities. The three Directors from the Amherst-Cheektowaga-Tonawanda HOME Consortium converse on a regular basis to review project status, discuss compliance issues, problems, and innovative programs.

Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

To improve coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies, the Town's offices of Community Development, Senior Services, and Youth Services continue to participate in the Cheektowaga Community Collaborative (C3). This group continues to meet on a regular basis with local non-profit agencies and representatives from the local educational community (school districts and Villa Maria College) to detect potential gaps in services and educate each other about available service solutions.

Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)

The 2020 Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing was created jointly through the efforts of the County of Erie, City of Buffalo, the Amherst-Cheektowaga-Tonawanda HOME Consortium, and the Town of Hamburg. In the report, the consultants identified a number of impediments and goals for overcoming those impediments. The Town's effort to address those issues are discussed below.

1. Suggested actions for expanding housing choice for members of the protected classes and other low-income households to areas outside of racially/ethnically concentrated areas of poverty include review zoning and land use to expand properties available for higher density/multi-family housing where appropriate, reduce minimum lot sizes for duplexes and multi-family development to reduce this as a barrier to development of these properties, and consider allowing duplex development without architectural approval to reduce potential for delay and opportunities to deny this type of development. In an effort to address this goal, the Buffalo Erie Niagara Land Improvement Corporation is utilizing Erie County ARPA funds to construct 5 new housing units on vacant lots previously acquired through the Erie County Tax Foreclosure Auction.

2. In an effort to continue to improve the quality of life in racially or ethnically concentrated areas of poverty through continued and/or expanded rehabilitation assistance, the Town continuously seeks and utilizes grant funds from the New York State Affordable Housing Corporation. These funds are provided to eligible homeowners in conjunction with HOME and CDBG funds, and will be given in the form a 40% loan, 60% grant format. In addition, CDBG Funds continue to be invested in these areas for infrastructure improvements in an effort to enhance safety and outward appearance in these neighborhoods.

3. In an effort to expand education and outreach efforts, the Office of Community Development has participated in taxpayer group meetings, mailed letters to individual residences affected by proposed capital projects, and continues to make informational posts on Town Social Media sites with the purpose of making as many families as possible aware of the programs supported with CDBG funds.

4. Our final goal is to support homeless service providers and the expansion of housing opportunities by reviewing ordinances to ensure transitional housing and other services are allowed in appropriate areas, and to provide additional support to homeless service providers. In an effort to achieve this goal, the Office of Community Development takes part in monthly meetings with the Homeless Alliance of Western New York to fully understand the issues at hand and what we can do to aid in the elimination of said issues.

The Town monitors its sub-recipients and housing development agencies on an on-going basis, utilizing a project/activity checklist and a project control form to ensure compliance with program regulations. This along with on-site reviews are used to conduct performance evaluations and ensure annual compliance with the regulations. In addition, staff members have spent substantial hours reviewing and updating program policies and procedures, and created a sub-recipient manual to improve the management of our programs.

The Community Development Office also provides close oversight of several of our sub-recipients, including the Village of Depew, Village of Sloan, and the Cheektowaga Economic Development Corporation. Such close oversight consists of Town staff involvement with project planning and continuous conversations throughout project execution. We have also created a sub-recipient manual for these entities to provide additional opportunities for preventing compliance problems before they occur.

In response to minority business outreach, on an annual basis when trying to recruit new contractors to be a part of our program, the Office of Community Development obtains the New York State certified minority contractors list and mails letters requesting said contractors participate in our program.

The Town notifies citizens of the availability of the draft CAPER report through a notice published in the Cheektowaga Bee, the Town's official newspaper, and on Town Social Media sites. The Cheektowaga Bee is available free to the public in libraries, public buildings, commercial establishments, and at various street corner boxes.

The notice in the Cheektowaga Bee advises the public of the two annual public hearings about the Community Development programs and of the availability of the draft CAPER for review in both local libraries, the Town Clerk's Office, the Villages of Depew and Sloan Clerk's Office, and the Community Development Office. Public access to the CAPER is enhanced by posting this document on the Town's website for easy access at www.tocny.org under the Community Development Department page.

Over the last year, the Town has seen an uptick in the need for the Emergency Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program. As a result we continue to focus rehab efforts on those residents with housing emergencies as defined in our policies and procedures, and maintain an approximate one year wait list for our Moderate Housing Rehabilitation Program. The Town also continues to focus on assistance to basic human services, such as transportation for senior citizens, youth programming, and housing support services.

Finally, utilizing our HOME funds on the acquisition/rehabilitation/resale to first-time homebuyers program is becoming increasingly difficult. The current housing market, along with current HUD regulations no longer allow for the acquisition and rehabilitation or new construction of existing single-family homes or vacant lots via old avenues. As a result we are refocusing HOME funds on existing, owner-occupied housing units for our moderate rehab program. Since our wait-list is lengthy, it was determined the best use of said funds would be to preserve our existing housing stock. We are also looking to utilize such funds for affordable rental housing projects in Town.
